1 AN ACT concerning

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## Sickle Cell Disease - Adults - Best Practices Treatment and Awareness Act

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Statewide Steering Committee on Service for Adults 4 with Sickle Cell Disease; requiring the Steering Committee to include 5 representatives from certain groups and organizations; providing for the duties 6 of the Steering Committee; requiring the Steering Committee to establish an 7 Adult Sickle Cell Disease Day Infusion Center in the State; requiring the 8 Center to be structured in a certain manner; requiring the Center to include 9 certain services; requiring the Steering Committee to work to expand a certain 10 Center to include certain services; requiring the Governor to include a certain appropriation of a certain amount in the State budget in certain fiscal years; 11 requiring the Steering Committee to develop and implement a certain case 12 management system; providing for services that a certain case management 13 14 system may include; requiring the Governor to include a certain appropriation 15 of a certain amount in the State budget in certain fiscal years; and generally relating to State services for the treatment and management of sickle cell 16 disease in adults. 17
