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- 1 OF THE SUPERSEDEAS BOND REQUIRED COLLECTIVELY OF ALL APPELLANTS TO
- 2 STAY ENFORCEMENT OF A JUDGMENT MAY NOT EXCEED \$100,000,000,
- 3 REGARDLESS OF THE AMOUNT OF THE JUDGMENT.
- 4 (B) IF AN APPELLEE PROVES BY A PREPONDERANCE OF THE EVIDENCE
- 5 THAT AN APPELLANT IS DISSIPATING ASSETS OUTSIDE THE ORDINARY COURSE
- 6 OF BUSINESS TO AVOID THE PAYMENT OF A JUDGMENT, THE COURT MAY
 - REQUIRE THE APPELLANT TO POST A BOND IN AN AMOUNT UP TO THE FULL
- 8 AMOUNT OF THE JUDGMENT.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to all civil actions pending on or filed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2007.
