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Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration – State Drug and Alcohol Abuse Council <u>Needs Assessment</u>

FOR the purpose of requiring the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration to conduct a certain needs assessment; requiring the Administration to submit the needs assessment to the State Drug and Alcohol Abuse Council; establishing the State Drug and Alcohol Abuse Council in the Office of the Governor; providing for the membership of the Council; requiring the Governor to designate the chair of the Council; providing for the terms of the members of the Council; specifying the terms of the initial members of the Council; authorizing members of the Council to receive a certain reimbursement; providing that a majority of the voting members of the Council is a quorum; authorizing the Council to adopt certain procedures and consult with State agencies; authorizing the chair to designate certain individuals to serve on a committee or task force of the Council; requiring the Council to meet at a least four times a year; providing for the purpose and duties of the Council; requiring the Office of the Governor to designate staff for the Council; and generally relating to the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Administration and the State Drug and Alcohol Abuse Council a needs
