#### 1 AN ACT concerning

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#### Milk Products – Farmstead Cheese Production – Pilot Study

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a milk processor – farmstead cheese producer permit; 4 authorizing the holder of a milk processor - farmstead cheese producer permit 5 to perform certain functions and to produce farmstead cheese; requiring the 6 Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to issue only a certain number of 7 milk processor - farmstead cheese producer permits; establishing certain qualifications for a certain milk processor – farmstead cheese producer permit; 8 9 providing for the expiration date of a milk processor – farmstead cheese producer permit; exempting the sale of farmstead cheese from a certain 10 prohibition on the sale of raw milk; defining a certain term; providing for the 11 12 termination of this Act; and generally relating to a pilot study for the production 13 of farmstead cheese.
