9 [(3)] (4) In the case of a victim of homicide, the necessary expenses 10 for transportation of the body from the site of the autopsy or examination to a location 11 within the State specified by the victim's family.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectJuly 1, 2007.
