AN ACT concerning

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## Higher Education – Scholarship Program for Youth at Risk of Joining a Criminal Gang

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Scholarship Program for Youth at Risk of Joining a Criminal Gang; requiring the Governor to include a certain amount of funds 5 6 in the budget for the scholarship program; requiring the Office of Student 7 Financial Assistance within the Maryland Higher Education Commission to 8 publicize the availability of the scholarships and to make scholarship awards, 9 not to exceed a certain amount per recipient, which may be used for certain expenses at certain public institutions of higher education; requiring a 10 scholarship recipient to meet certain eligibility criteria to obtain and retain an 11 award; requiring the Commission to adopt certain regulations; authorizing the 12 Office to enter into certain reciprocal scholarship agreements; requiring funds to 13 14 be retained by the Commission under certain circumstances; establishing a 15 certain scholarship fund to receive money and other property; defining certain terms; requiring the Office to report scholarship recipients' names to certain 16 legislative members on or before a certain date; requiring the Commission to 17 report to the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally 18 relating to the establishment of the Scholarship Program for Youth at Risk of 19 Joining a Criminal Gang. 20
