3 FOR the purpose of requiring an applicant for certain State health programs to 4 identify the employer of a proposed beneficiary or the employer of a certain 5 family member of a proposed beneficiary; requiring the Department of Health 6 and Mental Hygiene to publish a report identifying certain employers and 7 providing certain information; requiring the report to protect the confidentiality 8 of individuals in the State health programs; requiring the Department to report 9 to the General Assembly on or before a certain date; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the disclosure of information regarding employers of 10 individuals enrolled in State health programs. 11
