FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene, in conjunction with the Governor's Workforce Investment Board and certain regulatory boards to identify make certain findings concerning certain barriers to licensing or certifying individuals who have certain training and experience in providing health care through military service that is equivalent to certain requirements for licensure or certification; requiring certain regulatory boards to draft certain regulations and legislation that will expedite certain licensure and certification of individuals who have certain training and experience in providing health care through military service that is equivalent to certain requirements for licensure or certification; requiring certain regulatory boards to adopt certain regulations on or before a certain date: requiring the Secretary. in conjunction with the Governor's Workforce Investment Board and certain regulatory boards to make, to report certain findings and recommendations to the General Assembly for implementation of certain legislation regarding certain ways to expedite the inclusion of individuals who have certain training and experience into a certain health care work force on or before a certain date:
