 17 AND MEETING ATTENDANCE IN ORGANIZATIONS THAT DISSEMINATE TRAINING
 18 AND EDUCATION AND PROVIDE GUIDANCE TO VOLUNTEER EMERGENCY
 19 SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS AND THEIR MEMBERS AND REPRESENT THEIR
 20 INTERESTS ON A STATE AND NATIONAL LEVEL;
- 21 (7) PROVIDE FUEL, INSURANCE, AND MAINTENANCE TO VEHICLES 22 OWNED AND OPERATED BY THE ASSOCIATION AND USED IN REPRESENTING THE 23 VOLUNTEERS AND DISSEMINATING INFORMATION THROUGHOUT THE STATE;
- 24 (8) PROVIDE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES INCLUDING ACCOUNTING, 25 AUDITING, AND LEGAL CONSULTATION AND OPERATIONAL COSTS ASSOCIATED 26 WITH THE OBJECTIVES ESTABLISHED IN THIS SUBSECTION; AND
- 27 (9) PROMOTE, DISSEMINATE, AND ADVOCATE PROGRAMS AND 28 SERVICES THAT PERTAIN TO IMPROVING THE SAFETY, HEALTH, AND 29 WELLBEING OF FIRE AND RESCUE PERSONNEL THROUGHOUT THE STATE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2007.
