A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

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Task Force to Study Risk Management and Loss Control

FOR the purpose of creating the Task Force to Study Risk Management and Loss Control; providing for the membership of the Task Force; authorizing the Task Force to consult with certain individuals and entities in performing the duties of the Task Force; requiring units of State government to provide certain data under certain circumstances; requiring the Department of Legislative Services and the Office of Legislative Audits to provide staff to the Task Force; providing for certain duties of the Task Force; requiring the Task Force to make certain reports to the Governor and General Assembly on or before certain dates; providing that members of the Task Force are entitled to a certain reimbursement; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Study Risk Management and Loss Control.

14 Preamble

WHEREAS, The State has and will continue to face challenges to protect State employees and minimize unnecessary State expenditures; and

WHEREAS, Failure to implement programs designed to protect the State from legal liability and exposure resulting from hazardous situations, including but not limited to environmental hazards and deficiencies in State facilities; and

WHEREAS, Inadequate oversight of loss control or workplace safety can result in noncompliance with federal or State laws or regulations and negative fiscal impact on the State; and

1 2	WHEREAS, An effective, consistent, and measurable risk management policy is critical to ensuring loss control on a statewide basis; and			
3 4 5	WHEREAS, There is a need for improved oversight of the development, funding and evaluation of governmental policy and programs to facilitate statewide loss prevention; now, therefore,			
6 7	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:			
8	(a)	There is a Task Force to Study Risk Management and Loss Control.		
9	(b)	The 7	Task Force consists of the following members:	
10 11	Senate;	(1)	Three members of the Senate, appointed by the President of the	
12 13	(2) Three members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House;			
14		(3)	The Secretary of General Services, or the Secretary's designee;	
15		(4)	The Secretary of the Environment, or the Secretary's designee;	
16		(5)	The Legislative Auditor, or the Auditor's designee;	
17 18	(6) The President of the Injured Workers' Insurance Fund, or the President's designee;			
19		(7)	The State Treasurer, or the Treasurer's designee; and	
20 21	Council.	(8)	The chair of the State Employee Risk Management Advisory	
22 23 24	(c) The Task Force shall be cochaired by one member of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, and one member of the House of Delegates appointed by the Speaker of the House.			
25 26	(d) Legislative	(1) Audits	The Department of Legislative Services and the Office of shall jointly provide staff.	

1 2 3	(2) To the extent practicable, the members of the Task Force shall reasonably reflect the geographic, racial, ethnic, cultural, and gender diversity of this State.
4	(e) A member of the Task Force:
5	(1) May not receive compensation as a member of the Task Force; but
6 7	(2) Is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
8	(f) (1) The Task Force shall:
9 10	(i) Examine the effectiveness of risk management programs in each unit of State government;
11 12	(ii) Identify potential situations for loss exposure that are not addressed by current State risk management initiatives or other programs;
13 14	(iii) Review performance audits to identify noncompliance with State laws or regulations that could pose significant fiscal impacts; and
15 16 17	(iv) Develop recommendations to improve risk management and loss prevention programs that are not found to be effective and to facilitate comprehensive statewide coordination of loss control.
18 19	(2) (i) At the request of the cochairs, other units of State government, including quasi-corporations, shall provide data and other support.
20 21	(ii) The Task Force may consult with other individuals and entities, as determined appropriate by the cochair.
22 23 24	(g) (1) On or before December 31, 2007, the Task Force shall submit a preliminary report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with $\S 2-1246$ of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly.
25 26 27	(2) On or before December 31, 2008, the Task Force shall submit a final report of its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly.
28	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

July 1, 2007. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 6 months and, at the

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- end of December 31, 2008, with no further action required by the General Assembly,
- 2 this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
