## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Alcoholic Beverages - Alcohol Awareness Program - Classroom Attendance

- FOR the purpose of requiring classroom attendance for all instruction sessions and test taking in an initial training course of an alcoholic beverages program for certain alcoholic beverages license holders or their designated employees; requiring classroom attendance only for test taking in a certain retraining course; making certain stylistic corrections; and generally relating to the alcohol awareness program for holders of alcoholic beverages licenses and designated employees.
