- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2	(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
3 4	(5) "Foundation program" means the product of the annual per pupil foundation amount and a county's full–time equivalent enrollment.
5 6	(8) "Local share of the foundation program" means the product of the local contribution rate and a county's wealth.

20 21 22 23 24	(a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, each child who resides in this State and is 5 years old or older and under 16 shall attend a public school regularly during the entire school year unless the child is otherwise receiving regular, thorough instruction during the school year in the studies usually taught in the public schools to children of the same age.
25 26 27 28 29	(2) In accordance with regulations of the State Board of Education, a child who resides in this State and is 5 years old may be exempted from mandatory school attendance for 1 year if the child's parent or guardian files a written request with the local school system asking that the child's attendance be delayed due to the child's level of maturity.

1	(3) Except as provided in subsection (f) of this section or in regulations
2	of the State Board of Education, each child who resides in this State shall attend a
3	kindergarten program regularly during the school year prior to entering the first
4	grade unless the child is otherwise receiving regular, thorough instruction in the skills
5	and studies usually taught in a kindergarten program of a public school.

- 6 (b) **(1)** A county superintendent, school principal, or an individual authorized by the county superintendent or principal may excuse a student for a lawful absence.
- 9 **(2)** (I)UNLESS A STUDENT IS EXCUSED FOR A LAWFUL ABSENCE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBSECTION, FOR EACH DAY THAT THE 10 STUDENT IS ABSENT, THE PERSON WHO HAS LEGAL CUSTODY OR CARE AND 11 CONTROL OF THE STUDENT SHALL REPAY TO THE DEPARTMENT AN AMOUNT 12 EQUIVALENT TO THE PER-DIEM PER PUPIL AMOUNT OF THE STATE SHARE OF 13 THE FOUNDATION PROGRAM, AS DEFINED UNDER § 5-202(A)(12) OF THIS 14 15 ARTICLE, DISTRIBUTED TO THE COUNTY BOARD.
- 16 THE (II)DEPARTMENT SHALL TRANSFER THE 17 **COLLECTED** REIMBURSEMENTS **UNDER** THIS **SUBSECTION** THE 18 COMPTROLLER FOR DEPOSIT INTO THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE.
- 19 (c) Each person who has legal custody or care and control of a child who is 5 20 years old or older and under 16 shall see that the child attends school or receives 21 instruction as required by this section.
