2 Environment – Phosphorus – Dishwashing Detergent

FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from using, selling, manufacturing, or
 distributing for sale a certain dishwashing detergent that contains greater than
 a certain amount of phosphorus after a certain date; requiring the Department
 of the Environment to report to the Governor and General Assembly by a
 certain date; repealing certain obsolete language; and generally relating to
 phosphorus in dishwashing detergents.

9 10	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
11	Article – Environment
12	9–1502.
13	This subtitle does not apply to a cleaning agent that is:
14 15	(1) A detergent used in dairy, beverage, or food processing cleaning equipment;
16 17	(2) A phosphoric acid product, including a sanitizer, brightener, acid cleaner, or metal conditioner;
18 19	(3) A detergent used in hospitals, veterinary hospitals or clinics, or health care facilities or in agricultural production;
20	(4) A detergent used by industry for metal cleaning or conditioning;
21 22	(5) Manufactured, stored, or distributed for use or sale outside of the State;
23 24	(6) Used in any laboratory, including a biological laboratory, research facility, chemical laboratory, and engineering laboratory; or
25 26	(7) Used in a commercial laundry that provides laundry services for a hospital, health care facility, or veterinary hospital.

1 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, [after December 1, 2 1985,] a person may not use, sell, manufacture, or distribute for use or sale within the 3 State any cleaning agent that contains more than 0.0 percent phosphorus by weight 4 expressed as elemental phosphorus except for an amount not exceeding 0.5 percent 5 phosphorus that is incidental to manufacturing.

- 6 (b) [After December 1, 1985] **EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C)** 7 **OF THIS SECTION**, a person may use, sell, manufacture, or distribute for use or sale a 8 cleaning agent that contains greater than 0.0 percent phosphorus by weight, but does 9 not exceed 8.7 percent phosphorus by weight that is:
- 10 (1) A detergent used in a dishwashing machine, whether commercial 11 or household; or

12 (2) A substance the Secretary, by rule and regulation, excludes from 13 the 0.0 percent phosphorus limitation of subsection (a) of this section based on a 14 finding that compliance with this section would:

15

(i) Create a significant hardship on the user; or

16 (ii) Be unreasonable because of the lack of an adequate17 substitute cleaning agent.

18 (C) AFTER DECEMBER 1, 2008 JULY 1, 2010 JANUARY 1, 2010, A 19 PERSON MAY NOT USE, SELL, MANUFACTURE, OR DISTRIBUTE FOR USE OR SALE 20 WITHIN THE STATE ANY DETERGENT USED FOR USE IN A HOUSEHOLD 21 DISHWASHING MACHINE, WHETHER COMMERCIAL OR HOUSEHOLD, THAT 22 CONTAINS MORE THAN 0.5 PERCENT PHOSPHORUS BY WEIGHT.

23 <u>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, by December 1, 2008,</u>
 24 <u>the Maryland Department of the Environment shall report to the Governor and,</u>
 25 <u>subject to § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on:</u>

- 26 (1) the prospective availability of detergents containing 0.5 percent
 27 phosphorus or less, by weight, for use in commercial dishwashing machines; and
- 28 (2) <u>a recommended date by which the use of such detergents in</u>
 29 <u>commercial dishwashing machines may be reasonably required.</u>

30 SECTION 2. <u>3.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 31 effect October 1, 2007.
