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## Maryland Estate Tax <u>- Returns</u>

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring that a Maryland estate tax return be filed with the 4 Comptroller instead of with the register of wills; altering a requirement that a 5 register of wills certify to the Comptroller the amount of inheritance tax paid for certain decedents under certain circumstances; altering the calculation of the 6 7 Maryland estate tax under certain circumstances with respect to certain property of a nonresident decedent that passes from a decedent to a surviving 8 9 spouse or to a public, charitable, or religious use; altering the calculation of the Maryland estate tax under certain circumstances with respect to certain 10 property of a decedent that passes to a surviving spouse who is not a citizen of 11 the United States; providing for the application of this Act; and generally 12 13 relating to the Maryland estate tax.

(b) If a federal estate tax return is not required to be filed but a federal estate tax return would be required to be filed if the applicable exclusion amount under § 2010(c) of the Internal Revenue Code were no greater than \$1,000,000, the

(c) (1) After a person files a Maryland estate tax return, the person shall file an amended Maryland estate tax return with the [register] <b>COMPTROLLER</b> if the Maryland estate tax liability is increased because of:
(i) a change in the federal gross estate, federal taxable estate, federal estate tax, or other change as determined under the Internal Revenue Code;
(ii) after-discovered property;
(iii) a correction to the value of previously reported property;
$(iv)  a \ correction \ to \ the \ amount \ of \ previously \ claimed \ deductions;$ or
(v) any other correction to a previously filed return.
(2) The amended return shall be filed within 90 days after the later to occur of the date of the event that caused the increase in the Maryland estate tax liability or the date on which the person required to file an amended Maryland estate tax return learned or reasonably should have learned of the increase in the Maryland

5 6 7	(b) An extension of time to file the Maryland estate tax return granted by the Comptroller under § 7–305.1 of this subtitle does not extend the time for remitting the Maryland estate tax.
8 9 10 11 12	(c) If an amended Maryland estate tax return is filed pursuant to § 7–305(c) of this subtitle, the person responsible for filing the amended Maryland estate tax return shall pay the additional Maryland estate tax developed on the amended Maryland estate tax return to the Comptroller when the amended Maryland estate tax return is filed with the [register] <b>COMPTROLLER</b> .

14 15 16 17 18 19	(a) Notwithstanding an Act of Congress that repeals or reduces the federal credit under § 2011 of the Internal Revenue Code, the provisions of this subtitle in effect before the passage of the Act of Congress shall apply with respect to a decedent who dies after the effective date of the Act of Congress so as to continue the Maryland estate tax in force without reduction in the same manner as if the federal credit had not been repealed or reduced.
