1 AN ACT concerning

Disabled Law Enforcement Officers and Rescue Workers - Property Tax Credit

4 FOR the purpose of altering certain enabling authority for the Mayor and City Council 5 of Baltimore City or the governing body of a county or of a municipal 6 corporation to grant a certain property tax credit for certain residential real 7 property owned by certain individuals to authorize a property tax credit for 8 certain property owned by certain disabled law enforcement officers and rescue 9 workers; defining a certain term; altering a certain definition; providing for the 10 application of this Act; and generally relating to a property tax credit for certain residential real property owned by certain disabled law enforcement officers and 11 12 rescue workers.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 **(2) "DISABLED LAW ENFORCEMENT** OFFICER OR RESCUE 3 WORKER" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO: 4 **(I)** HAS BEEN FOUND TO BE PERMANENTLY AND TOTALLY 5 DISABLED BY AN ADMINISTRATIVE BODY OR COURT OF COMPETENT JURISDICTION AUTHORIZED TO MAKE SUCH A DETERMINATION; AND 6 7 **(II) BECAME DISABLED:** 8 1. AS A RESULT OF OR IN THE COURSE OF EMPLOYMENT AS A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER; OR 9 10 2. WHILE IN THE ACTIVE SERVICE OF A FIRE, RESCUE, OR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE, UNLESS THE DISABILITY WAS THE 11 RESULT OF THE INDIVIDUAL'S OWN WILLFUL MISCONDUCT OR ABUSE OF 12 13 ALCOHOL OR DRUGS. "Dwelling" means real property that: 14 **[**(2)**] (3)** (i) 15 1. is the legal residence of a **DISABLED LAW** ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR RESCUE WORKER OR A surviving spouse; and 16 17 2. is occupied by not more than two families. "Dwelling" includes the lot or curtilage and structures 18 (ii) 19 necessary to use the real property as a residence. 20 **[**(3)**]**(4) "Fallen law enforcement officer or rescue worker" means an individual who dies: 21 as a result of or in the course of employment as a law 22 (i) 23 enforcement officer; or 24 while in the active service of a fire, rescue, or emergency (ii) medical service, unless the death was the result of the individual's own willful 25 26 misconduct or abuse of alcohol or drugs.

[(4)] (5) "Surviving spouse" means a surviving spouse, who has not
remarried, of a fallen law enforcement officer or rescue worker.

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1 (b) The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City or the governing body of a 2 county or municipal corporation may grant, by law, a property tax credit under this 3 section against the county or municipal corporation property tax imposed on a 4 dwelling that is owned by a **DISABLED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR RESCUE** 5 **WORKER OR A** surviving spouse of a fallen law enforcement officer or rescue worker:

6 (1)if the dwelling owned was BY THE DISABLED LAW 7 ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR RESCUE WORKER AT THE TIME THE LAW 8 ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR RESCUE WORKER WAS ADJUDGED TO BE 9 **PERMANENTLY AND TOTALLY DISABLED OR** by the fallen law enforcement officer or rescue worker at the time of the fallen law enforcement officer's or rescue worker's 10 death: 11

12 (2)if THE DISABLED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR RESCUE WORKER WAS DOMICILED IN THE STATE AS OF THE DATE THE DISABLED LAW 13 ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR RESCUE WORKER WAS ADJUDGED TO BE 14 **PERMANENTLY AND TOTALLY DISABLED OR** the fallen law enforcement officer or 15 rescue worker or the surviving spouse was domiciled in the State as of the date of the 16 fallen law enforcement officer's or rescue worker's death and the dwelling was 17 acquired BY THE DISABLED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR RESCUE WORKER 18 19 WITHIN 2 YEARS OF THE DATE THE DISABLED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR RESCUE WORKER WAS ADJUDGED TO BE PERMANENTLY AND TOTALLY 20 21 **DISABLED OR** by the surviving spouse within 2 years of the fallen law enforcement 22 officer's or rescue worker's death; or

(3) if the dwelling was acquired after THE DISABLED LAW
ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR RESCUE WORKER OR the surviving spouse qualified
for a credit for a former dwelling under item (1) or (2) of this subsection, to the extent
of the previous credit.

27 (c) A county or municipal corporation may provide, by law, for:

(1) the amount and duration of a property tax credit allowed under
this section; and

30 (2) any other provision necessary to carry out the provisions of this
31 section.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 June 1, 2007, and shall be applicable to all taxable years beginning after June 30, 3 2007.
