1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Physicians – Delegation Agreement – Supervision of Physician Assistants**

- FOR the purpose of altering the conditions under which the State Board of Physicians may authorize a physician who works in certain settings to delegate medical acts under a certain delegation agreement; altering the conditions under which a physician who works in certain settings may supervise a certain number of physician assistants directly or as an alternate supervising physician; and generally relating to physician supervision of physician assistants under a delegation agreement.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – Health Occupations

19 (i) The Board may [not] authorize a physician to delegate medical acts 20 under a delegation agreement to:

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WHO HAVE LESS THAN 5 YEARS OF FULL-TIME EXPERIENCE AS A PHYSICIAN **ASSISTANT: AND** (2) AN UNLIMITED NUMBER OF PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS WHO HAVE 5 OR MORE YEARS OF FULL-TIME EXPERIENCE AS A PHYSICIAN **ASSISTANT.** [except in a hospital or in the following nonhospital settings: (1)A correctional facility; (2)A detention center; or (3)A public health facility.] (k) A physician may supervise a physician assistant: In accordance with a delegation agreement approved by the Board (1)under this subtitle; or (2)As an alternate supervising physician if: The alternate physician (i) supervising supervises in accordance with a delegation agreement filed with the Board; [The] AT ANY ONE TIME, THE alternate supervising (ii) physician supervises: 1. [no] **NO** more than four physician assistants [at any one time, except in a hospital, correctional facility, detention center, or public health facility:] WHO HAVE LESS THAN 5 YEARS OF FULL-TIME EXPERIENCE AS A PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT; AND 2. AN UNLIMITED OF PHYSICIAN NUMBER ASSISTANTS WHO HAVE 5 OR MORE YEARS OF FULL-TIME EXPERIENCE AS A **PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT;** The alternate supervising physician's period of supervision, (iii) in the absence of the primary supervising physician, does not exceed: 1. The period of time specified in the delegation

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NO more than [two] **FOUR** physician assistants [at any one time,]

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2. A period of 45 consecutive days at any one time; and 1 2 (iv) The physician assistant performs only those medical acts 3 that: 4 1. Have been delegated under the delegation agreement 5 filed with the Board; and 6 2. Are within the scope of practice of the alternate 7 supervising physician. 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2007. 9
