A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Labor and Employment – Scheduled Pay**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring employees who report to work at the request of an
4 employer, and are not offered work, to be compensated a certain amount;
5 authorizing a certain employee to bring a certain action; requiring a circuit
6 court to award reasonable attorney's fees and costs to a prevailing employee;
7 authorizing a circuit court to award certain remedies to a prevailing employee;
8 specifying that no criminal penalties may be imposed under certain
9 circumstances; and generally relating to payment for scheduled work.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Labor and Employment**

18 **3–710.**

19 (A) **AN EMPLOYEE WHO REPORTS TO WORK AT THE REQUEST OF THE**
20 **EMPLOYEE'S EMPLOYER AND IS NOT OFFERED WORK BY THE EMPLOYER SHALL**
21 **BE COMPENSATED AT THE EMPLOYEE'S REGULAR HOURLY RATE FOR THE**

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 **GREATER OF THE EMPLOYEE'S SCHEDULED HOURS OF WORK FOR THE DAY AND**
2 **4 HOURS.**

3 **(B) AN EMPLOYEE MAY BRING A CIVIL ACTION AGAINST AN EMPLOYER**
4 **IN A CIRCUIT COURT OF COMPETENT JURISDICTION TO ENFORCE THE**
5 **PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.**

6 **(C) (1) THE CIRCUIT COURT SHALL AWARD TO A PREVAILING**
7 **EMPLOYEE ALL REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES AND COSTS.**

8 **(2) THE CIRCUIT COURT MAY AWARD TO A PREVAILING**
9 **EMPLOYEE INJUNCTIVE RELIEF, BACK PAY, AND ANY OTHER REMEDY PROVIDED**
10 **BY LAW OR IN EQUITY.**

11 **(D) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, NO CRIMINAL**
12 **PENALTIES MAY BE IMPOSED FOR A VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS**
13 **SECTION.**

14 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect**
15 **October 1, 2007.**
