A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Licensed Cosmetologists – Practice Allowed in Specified Places

- FOR the purpose of allowing licensed estheticians and nail technicians to provide services outside a beauty salon under certain circumstances; allowing licensed cosmetologists, estheticians, and nail technicians to practice and provide services in certain medical services facilities under certain circumstances; and generally relating to licensed cosmetologists, estheticians, and nail technicians.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 (a) Except as provided in §§ 5-302 and 5-303 of this title and subsection (b)
18 of this section, a person may not practice cosmetology, PROVIDE ESTHETIC
19 SERVICES, OR PROVIDE NAIL TECHNICIAN SERVICES in any place other than:

1	(1) a beauty salon that holds a beauty salon permit; or
2 3	(2) a barbershop that holds a barbershop permit issued under Title 4 of this article.
4 5	(b) (1) A licensed cosmetologist, ESTHETICIAN, OR NAIL TECHNICIAN may practice cosmetology AND PROVIDE SERVICES in:
6 7 8	(I) A FACILITY IN WHICH BEAUTIFICATION-ORIENTED MEDICAL SERVICES, AUTHORIZED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE, ARE PROVIDED;
9 10	(II) the residence of an individual confined to the residence by reason of a physical or mental infirmity[,];
11 12	(III) [in] an assisted living facility as defined in § 19–1801 of the Health – General Article[,];
13 14	(IV) [in] a hospice facility defined in § 19–901(c) of the Health – General Article[,];
15 16	(V) [in] a nursing home as defined in § 19–1401(e) of the Health – General Article[,]; or
17 18	(VI) [in] a hospital as defined in § 19–301 of the Health – General Article or a similar institution[, by appointment, if:
19 20	$(i) \qquad \mbox{the licensed cosmetologist is sponsored by a beauty salon} \label{eq:integral} that holds a beauty salon permit; and$
21	(ii) the patron is a customer of the beauty salon.
22 23	(2) An individual who holds a limited license to provide nail technician services may provide nail technician services in a barbershop].
24 25	(2) TO PRACTICE IN ANY OF THE LOCATIONS SPECIFIED IN THIS SUBSECTION:
26 27	(I) THE LICENSED COSMETOLOGIST, ESTHETICIAN, OR NAIL TECHNICIAN SHALL BE SPONSORED BY A BEAUTY SALON IN WHICH THE

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1 COSMETOLOGIST, ESTHETICIAN, OR NAIL TECHNICIAN IS AUTHORIZED TO 2 PRACTICE;

3 (II) THE PATRON TO WHOM THE SERVICES ARE RENDERED
4 SHALL BE A CUSTOMER OF THE BEAUTY SALON; AND

5 (III) THE SERVICES SHALL BE RENDERED BY APPOINTMENT
 6 THROUGH THE BEAUTY SALON.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 2007.
