# 1 AN ACT concerning

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# Licensed Cosmetologists - Practice Allowed in Specified Places

- FOR the purpose of allowing licensed estheticians and nail technicians to provide services outside a beauty salon under certain circumstances; allowing licensed cosmetologists, estheticians, and nail technicians to practice and provide services in certain medical services facilities under certain circumstances; and generally relating to licensed cosmetologists, estheticians, and nail technicians.

- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

#### **Article - Business Occupations and Professions**

2 3 4	(a) Except as provided in §§ 5–302 and 5–303 of this title and subsection (b) of this section, a person may not practice cosmetology, <b>PROVIDE ESTHETIC SERVICES, OR PROVIDE NAIL TECHNICIAN SERVICES</b> in any place other than:
5	(1) a beauty salon that holds a beauty salon permit; or
6 7	(2) a barbershop that holds a barbershop permit issued under Title 4 of this article.
8 9	(b) (1) A licensed cosmetologist, ESTHETICIAN, OR NAIL TECHNICIAN may practice cosmetology AND PROVIDE SERVICES in:
10 11 12	(I) A FACILITY IN WHICH BEAUTIFICATION-ORIENTED MEDICAL SERVICES, AUTHORIZED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE, ARE PROVIDED;
13 14	(II) the residence of an individual confined to the residence by reason of a physical or mental infirmity[,];
15 16	(III) [in] an assisted living facility as defined in § 19–1801 of the Health – General Article[,];
17 18	(IV) [in] a hospice facility defined in § 19–901(c) of the Health – General Article[,];
19 20	(V) [in] a nursing home as defined in § 19–1401(e) of the Health – General Article[,]; or
21 22	(VI) [in] a hospital as defined in § 19–301 of the Health – General Article or a similar institution[, by appointment, if:
23 24	(i) the licensed cosmetologist is sponsored by a beauty salor that holds a beauty salon permit; and
25	(ii) the patron is a customer of the beauty salon.

1 2	(2) TO PRACTICE IN ANY OF THE LOCATIONS SPECIFIED IN THIS SUBSECTION:
3 4 5 6	(I) THE LICENSED COSMETOLOGIST, ESTHETICIAN, OR NAIL TECHNICIAN SHALL BE SPONSORED BY A BEAUTY SALON IN WHICH THE COSMETOLOGIST, ESTHETICIAN, OR NAIL TECHNICIAN IS AUTHORIZED TO PRACTICE;
7 8	(II) THE PATRON TO WHOM THE SERVICES ARE RENDERED SHALL BE A CUSTOMER OF THE BEAUTY SALON; AND
9 10	(III) THE SERVICES SHALL BE RENDERED BY APPOINTMENT THROUGH THE BEAUTY SALON.
11 12	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2007.
