## 1 AN ACT concerning

# Maryland Health Insurance Plan - Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program - Modifications

- FOR the purpose of requiring an individual to be enrolled in a certain prescription
  drug plan or Medicare Advantage Plan as a condition of eligibility for the Senior
  Prescription Drug Assistance Program; altering a certain definition; extending
  the termination date of the Program; making certain clarifying changes; and
  generally relating to the Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program.

- 19SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF20MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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14 - 510.In Part II of this subtitle the following words have the meanings (a) indicated. "Eligible individual" means an individual who: (b) (1)is a resident of Maryland; (2)is a Medicare beneficiary enrolled in the Medicare Part D **(I)** Voluntary Prescription Drug Benefit Program or a Medicare Advantage Plan that provides Part D coverage; AND IS ENROLLED IN A PART D PRESCRIPTION DRUG PLAN **(II)** OR MEDICARE ADVANTAGE PLAN THAT PARTICIPATES IN THE SENIOR PRESCRIPTION DRUG ASSISTANCE PROGRAM IN ACCORDANCE WITH FEDERAL **REQUIREMENTS;** is not enrolled in a health benefit plan, other than a Medicare Part (3)D prescription drug plan or a Medicare Advantage Plan, that provides prescription drug benefits at the time that the individual applies for enrollment in the Program; has an annual household income at or below 300% of the federal (4)poverty guidelines: is not eligible for a full federal low-income subsidy under 42 C.F.R. (5)§ 423.772; and (6) pays the premium, and copayments or coinsurance, for the Program. "Enrollee" means an individual enrolled in the Program. (c) "Program" means the Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program (d) established under Part II of this subtitle. Chapter 153 of the Acts of 2002, as amended by Chapter 282 of the Acts of 2005 and Chapter 345 of the Acts of 2006 SECTION 13. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

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1 (1) No later than June 1, 2003, the Secretary of Health and Mental 2 Hygiene and the carrier that is required to offer the Short–Term Prescription Drug 3 Subsidy Plan under Title 15, Subtitle 6 of the Health – General Article shall transfer 4 all Plan records, data, and other information necessary to operate and administer the 5 Senior Prescription Drug Program established under this Act to the Board of the 6 Maryland Health Insurance Plan.

7 (2) Each individual enrolled in the Short-Term Prescription Drug 8 Subsidy Plan, established under Title 15, Subtitle 6 of the Health – General Article, on 9 June 30, 2003 shall, at the option of the enrollee and subject to the payment of all 10 necessary premiums and copayments, be automatically enrolled in the Senior 11 Prescription Drug Program established under this Act.

12 (3) It is the intent of the General Assembly that the transition of 13 enrollees from the Short-Term Prescription Drug Subsidy Plan to the Senior 14 Prescription Drug Program be accomplished without interruption of benefits for 15 enrollees.

16 (4) [Benefits] **SUBSIDIES** shall be offered to enrollees through the 17 Senior Prescription Drug **ASSISTANCE** Program established under Title 14, Subtitle 18 5, Part II of the Insurance Article beginning [July 1, 2003] **JANUARY 1, 2006**. At the 19 end of December 31, [2007] **2009**, the Senior Prescription Drug **ASSISTANCE** 20 Program established under Title 14, Subtitle 5, Part II, as amended, shall be 21 abrogated and of no further force and effect.

(5) Beginning April 1, 2003, the carrier required to offer the
Short–Term Prescription Drug Subsidy Plan under Title 15, Subtitle 6 of the Health –
General Article and the Senior Prescription Drug Program under Title 14, Subtitle 5 of
the Insurance Article shall subsidize the Plan and beginning July 1, 2003, the
Program, using the value of the carrier's premium tax exemption.

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect28 June 1, 2007.
