A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Motor Vehicle Administration – Federal REAL ID Act of 2005 – Cost Estimate Report

FOR the purpose of requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to submit a certain report on the implementation of the federal REAL ID Act of 2005 to the General Assembly and the Governor on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the implementation of the federal REAL ID Act of 2005.

WHEREAS, The federal REAL ID Act of 2005 establishes a national identification card by mandating federal standards for state drivers' licenses and identification cards and requires states to share their motor vehicle databases; and

WHEREAS, The REAL ID Act mandates the documents that states must require to issue drivers' licenses and identification cards and requires states to place uniform information on every driver's license and identification card in a standard, machine–readable format; and

WHEREAS, Under the REAL ID Act, states must verify applicants' documents and retain paper copies for at least 7 years or digital copies for at least 10 years; and

WHEREAS, The REAL ID Act prohibits federal agencies and federally regulated commercial aircraft from accepting a driver's license or identification card issued by a state that has not fully complied with the Act; and

1 2 3	WHEREAS, Federal funding for financing the implementation of the REAL ID Act is authorized but not mandated and such funding has not yet been provided to any state; and
4 5 6	WHEREAS, The REAL ID Act places a costly, unfunded mandate on the people of this State and all other states to verify documents that must be presented to obtain or renew a driver's license or identification card; and
7 8 9	WHEREAS, The REAL ID Act will place enormous burdens on all Americans seeking driver's licenses or identification cards, such as longer lines, increased document requests, higher costs, and longer waiting periods; and
10 11 12 13	WHEREAS, The State Joint Committee on Federal Relations heard testimony from the National Conference of State Legislatures in 2005 and met with the Maryland Congressional Delegation during the 2005 and 2006 legislative interims to discuss concerns surrounding the implementation of the REAL ID Act; and
14 15 16 17	WHEREAS, The National Governors Association (NGA) determined that the REAL ID Act imposes an \$11 billion unfunded mandate on the states and the NGA has requested 10 years for states to enact laws, pass budgets, develop technology, hire staff, and educate the public to phase in changes mandated by the Act; and
18 19	WHEREAS, The REAL ID Act mandates implementation of the provisions of the Act by May 11, 2008; now, therefore,
20 21	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:
22 23 24	The Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration shall report on or before October 1, 2007, to the Governor and, subject to $\S 2-1246$ of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly on:
25 26	(1) the additional Motor Vehicle Administration staff and technology required to implement the federal REAL ID Act of 2005, including:
27 28 29	(i) computer systems needed to allow Motor Vehicle Administration staff to verify birth certificates, Social Security numbers, and citizenship status;
30 31	(ii) the security measures needed to safeguard the national database required under the REAL ID Act; and

1 2	(iii) the additional number of staff needed to verify documents required under the REAL ID Act;
3 4	$\ensuremath{\text{(2)}}$ the estimated additional State funding required to implement the REAL ID Act within the State;
5 6	(3) the estimated additional costs to State residents due to the implementation of the REAL ID Act, including:
7 8	(i) any increase in driver's license and identification card fees and all other fees imposed by the Motor Vehicle Administration;
9	(ii) any increase in local or State taxes rates; and
10	(iii) any fees imposed by local governments or the State;
11 12	(4) the percentage of the Motor Vehicle Administration's fiscal year 2008 budget intended to fund the implementation of the REAL ID Act;
13 14 15	(5) the estimated number of State residents who will be affected by the new driver's license and identification card requirements under the REAL ID Act during calendar years 2008 through 2018; and
16 17	(6) the estimated costs of implementing the REAL ID Act in every other state that has published its implementation cost estimates to date.
18 19 20 21	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2007. It shall remain effective for a period of 4 months and, at the end of October 31, 2007, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
