FOR the purpose of providing that the Motor Vehicle Administration is required to issue only one registration plate for a vehicle owned by a city, county, State, or federal fire department, a duly constituted volunteer fire department or rescue squad, or the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems; and generally relating to registration plates.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this title, when it registers a vehicle, the Administration shall issue to the owner:
(i) One registration plate, if [the]:

1. THE vehicle is a Class $D$ (motorcycle) vehicle, Class F (tractor) vehicle, or Class G (trailer) vehicle; OR
2. THE VEHICLE IS OWNED BY A CITY, COUNTY, STATE, OR FEDERAL FIRE DEPARTMENT, A DULY CONSTITUTED VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT OR RESCUE SQUAD, OR THE MARYLAND INSTITUTE FOR Emergency Medical Services Systems; and
(ii) Two registration plates for every other vehicle.
(2) However, as to temporary registration, the Administration may provide for the issuance of only one temporary registration plate for any vehicle.

(b) On a vehicle for which one registration plate is required, the plate shall be attached on the:
(1) Front of the vehicle for a Class F (tractor) vehicle; and
(2) Rear of the vehicle for every other vehicle.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2007.
