## A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

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## Maryland Commission for the Montgomery County Agricultural Reserve

3 FOR the purpose of creating the Maryland Commission for the Montgomery County 4 Agricultural Reserve; providing for the appointment of members of the 5 Commission; providing for the terms of the members of the Commission; 6 providing that a commissioner who fails to attend a certain number of meetings 7 during a certain time period is considered to have resigned; providing for 8 appointment of members in case of a vacancy during an unexpired term; 9 providing for the duties of the Commission; prohibiting a commissioner from receiving certain compensations, but authorizing a commissioner to receive 10 certain reimbursements; requiring the Commission to elect the chair of the 11 Commission; authorizing the Commission to accept certain funds under certain 12 13 circumstances; requiring certain State agencies to provide a liaison to the Commission; requiring the Commission to report annually to certain local 14 15 governmental units, and to the Governor and General Assembly; and generally 16 relating to the Maryland Commission for the Montgomery County Agricultural 17 Reserve.

2 3 4	WHEREAS, Montgomery County has a rich agricultural heritage centered in private and public lands that comprise more than 90,000 acres of farmland in the Montgomery County Agricultural Reserve; and
5 6 7 8 9	WHEREAS, The Agricultural Reserve was established more than 25 years ago by the Montgomery County Council and the Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission in response to the rapid disappearance of Montgomery County farms and is now a nationally acclaimed land–use model for preservation of agricultural lands; and
10 11 12	WHEREAS, Farming in Montgomery County plays an important role in the county's economy by employing 10,000 people and providing more than \$250 million to the economy annually; and
13 14 15	WHEREAS, Montgomery County provides wholesome, fresh, and essential agricultural products from its 350 horticultural enterprises and 577 farms, the majority of which are family—run operations that go back several generations; and
16 17 18	WHEREAS, The Agricultural Reserve preserves and protects farmland, open space, streams, and waterways, enhancing conservation and restoration efforts in the Chesapeake Bay watershed; and
19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, The Agricultural Reserve is a treasure to the county and to the State and provides vital educational, historical, and recreational resources to all citizens of the State, therefore stewardship of these lands is critical for future generations; and
23 24 25 26 27	WHEREAS, The survival of the Agricultural Reserve depends on public and private cooperation to promote and enhance its purpose and to protect it from future threats to its economic, cultural, and environmental integrity, thus, a Maryland Commission on the Montgomery County Agricultural Reserve is needed in order to secure its future; now, therefore,
