13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 15 Article Health General
- 16 18–104.

17 (a) The Secretary shall investigate, if feasible, means to prevent, treat, and 18 cure cancer.

4 6 SHALL BE ADMINISTERED A VACCINE THAT CONTAINS MATERIALS INTENDED
5 TO PREVENT THE OCCURRENCE OF CERVICAL CANCER.
