A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2007, and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2000, 2001, 2003, 2004, 2005, and 2006

FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of Eight $\mathbf{5}$ Hundred Six Million, Seven Hundred Ninety-Nine Thousand Dollars 6 (\$806,799,000), the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building, 7 construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and 8 capital equipment purchases of this State, for acquiring certain real estate in 9 connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other 10 organizations for certain development and improvement purposes, subject to the 11 requirement that certain grantees provide and expend certain matching funds 12by certain dates; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds 13 evidencing the loan; authorizing certain unexpended appropriations in certain 14 prior capital budgets and bond loans to be expended for other public projects; 15altering certain requirements for certain programs in certain prior capital 16 budgets and bond loans; providing that the authorizations of State Debt in 17certain prior capital budgets and bond loans be reduced by certain amounts; 18 providing for certain additional information to be detailed about each project in 19 the capital program; repealing a requirement for a certain appropriation; and 20 generally relating to the financing of certain capital projects. 21

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That:

18 (1)The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as 19 the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2007 in the total principal amount 20of \$806,799,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of 21 State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public 22Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through 238-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the 24Code. 25

26 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be 27 sold as a single issue of bonds under Section 8–122 of the State Finance and 28 Procurement Article.

(3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable architects' and engineers' fees:

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, the General Assembly 2 declares that it is the public policy of this State to manage State general obligation 3 bond debt in a manner that will maintain Maryland's AAA bond rating.
