## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Study Commission to Explore the Expanded Application of State Stipends for**  
3 **National Certification of Teachers**

4 FOR the purpose of establishing a Study Commission to Explore the Expanded  
5 Application of State Stipends for National Certification of Teachers; providing  
6 for the membership of the Study Commission; requiring the Governor to  
7 designate the chair of the Study Commission; requiring the State Department of  
8 Education to provide staff for the Study Commission; providing that a member  
9 of the Study Commission may not receive compensation but is entitled to  
10 certain reimbursement; requiring the Study Commission to assess the rigor of  
11 national certification for certain occupations and determine how these national  
12 certifications compare to national teacher certification and make certain  
13 recommendations; requiring the Study Commission to report certain findings  
14 and recommendations to the Governor and to the General Assembly on or before  
15 a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating  
16 to the expanded application of State stipends for national certification of  
17 teachers.

19 Article – Education  
20 Section 6–306(a) and (b)(2)

3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
4 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 **Article – Education**

6 6–306.

7 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

8 (2) “County grant for national certification” means an annual grant  
9 distributed to a teacher certified by the National Board for Professional Teaching  
10 Standards established:

11 (i) Outside of the collective bargaining process; or

12 (ii) As part of a collective bargaining agreement with the local  
13 employee organization.

14 (3) “School–based employee” means a certificated employee who works  
15 directly with students or teachers at a public school.

16 (b) (2) A classroom teacher or other nonadministrative school–based  
17 employee who holds a standard professional certificate or an advanced professional  
18 certificate who is employed by a county board and who holds a certificate issued by the  
19 National Board for Professional Teaching Standards shall receive a stipend from the  
20 State in an amount equal to the county grant for national certification, up to a  
21 maximum of \$2,000 per qualified individual.

22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

23 (a) There is a Study Commission to Explore the Expanded Application of  
24 State Stipends for National Certification of Teachers under § 6–306(b)(2) of the  
25 Education Article.

26 (b) The Study Commission consists of the following members:

27 (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President  
28 of the Senate;

1                   (2)     one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of  
2 the House;

3                   (3)     the State Superintendent of Schools, or the Superintendent's  
4 designee; and

5                   (4)     the following members, appointed by the Governor:

6                           (i)     one individual who holds a certificate issued by the National  
7 Board for Professional Teaching Standards;

8                           (ii)    one representative of the National Board for Professional  
9 Teaching Standards;

10                           (iii)  two local superintendents;

11                           (iv)  two representatives of local school systems that employ  
12 individuals who hold a certificate issued by the National Board for Professional  
13 Teaching Standards;

14                           (v)    one representative from a private Maryland university that  
15 has a program of teacher education; and

16                           (vi)  one representative from a public Maryland university that  
17 has a program of teacher education.

18           (c)     The Governor shall designate the chair of the Study Commission.

19           (d)     The State Department of Education shall provide staff for the Study  
20 Commission.

21           (e)     A member of the Study Commission:

22                           (1)    may not receive compensation as a member of the Study  
23 Commission; but

24                           (2)    is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard  
25 State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

26           (f)     The Study Commission shall:

27                           (1)    assess the rigor of national certification for speech–language  
28 pathologists, occupational therapists, school psychologists, physical therapists, school

1 counselors, and others to determine how each of these national certifications compares  
2 to national teacher certification by the National Board for Professional Teaching  
3 Standards;

4 (2) invite academic experts to submit testimony; and

5 (3) make recommendations regarding whether the stipends awarded  
6 to teachers and other school-based employees under § 6-306(b)(2) of the Education  
7 Article should be expanded to include speech-language pathologists, occupational  
8 therapists, physical therapists, school psychologists, school counselors, or others.

9 (g) On or before December 31, 2007, the Study Commission shall report its  
10 findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of  
11 the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

12 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
13 June 1, 2007. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31,  
14 2008, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be  
15 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
