## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Task Force to Study Prison Violence in Maryland

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force to Study Prison Violence in Maryland; specifying the chair, membership, and duties of the Task Force; requiring the 4 5 Task Force to make legislative recommendations; requiring the Task Force to meet with a certain frequency; requiring the Task Force to provide a certain 6 report to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; 7 8 providing for staffing of the Task Force; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force to Study Prison Violence in 9 10 Maryland.
- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, That:
- 13 (a) There is a Task Force to Study Prison Violence in Maryland.
- 14 (b) The Task Force shall be comprised of:
- one member of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House to serve as a cochair;
- one member of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate to serve as a cochair;
- 19 (3) the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services, or a 20 designee of the Secretary;

13 14 15 16	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2007. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of September 30, 2009, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
