### A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning 1

## **Baltimore County – Board of Education – Membership**

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the appointments made by the Governor to the Baltimore County Board of Education to be with the advice and consent of the 4 5 Senate of Maryland; requiring the composition of the membership of the Board 6 to reflect certain demographics in the county; and generally relating to the 7 Baltimore County Board of Education.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- **Article Education** 15 3 - 108.16
  - Except AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION 17 (1) (a) 18 AND for the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners established under 19 § 3–108.1 of this subtitle and counties listed in § 3–114 of this subtitle, the Governor 20 shall appoint the members of each county board from the residents of that county.

**(2)** THE GOVERNOR, WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE 1 2 SENATE OF MARYLAND, SHALL APPOINT THE MEMBERS OF THE BALTIMORE **COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION.** 3 4 3 - 109.5 (a) The Baltimore County Board consists of 12 members who shall be appointed as follows: 6 7 (1)Four from the county at large; 8 (2)One from each of the seven councilmanic districts in Baltimore 9 County; and One student member from the county at large. 10 (3)(b) The student member shall: 11 (1)12 Be an eleventh or twelfth grade student in the Baltimore (i) 13 County public school system; 14 (ii) Serve for 1 year; and 15 (iii) Advise the Board on the thoughts and feelings of students.
