## **Unclaimed Restitution - Disbursements and Use**

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Comptroller to distribute all unclaimed money from 4 certain judgments to the State Victims of Crime Fund for a certain purpose; 5 requiring the Comptroller to reduce a certain distribution by a certain amount if a victim entitled to certain restitution is located; requiring the State Board of 6 7 Victim Services to ensure that the money obtained from unclaimed restitution is used for certain grants; providing that it is the intent of the General Assembly 8 9 that if certain funding is terminated or reduced below a certain level, the Governor shall include a certain appropriation in the annual budget bill; and 10 generally relating to disbursements and use of unclaimed restitution. 11

2	terminated or reduced below a total of \$500,000 per fiscal year, the Governor shall
3	include in the annual budget bill each year an appropriation to the State Victims of
4	Crime Fund of \$500,000 less any funding provided by the federal projects and any
5	amount distributed to the Fund under the provisions of this Act.
