## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning
Education - Special Education Services - Children in a Home School Setting
FOR the purpose of requiring that a child with a disability in a home school setting be given the same consideration as a child with a disability in a private school setting for the purpose of the provision of certain special education services; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the provision of special education services.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Education

## 8-403.1.

(A) IN THIS SECTION, "CHILD IN A HOME SCHOOL SETTING" MEANS A CHILD WHO:
(1) DOES NOT ATTEND PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SCHOOL; AND

(2) RECEIVES REGULAR THOROUGH INSTRUCTION DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR IN THE STUDIES USUALLY TAUGHT IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS TO CHILDREN OF THE SAME AGE.
(B) A CHILD WITH A DISABILITY IN A HOME SCHOOL SETTING SHALL BE GIVEN THE SAME CONSIDERATION AS A CHILD WITH A DISABILITY IN A PRIVATE SCHOOL SETTING FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE PROVISION OF SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES UNDER THE FEDERAL INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES ACT, 20 U.S.C. § $1412(\mathrm{~A})(10)$.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2007.
