- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting an organization that collects dues from its members 4 from engaging in campaign finance activity except through an affiliated political 5 action committee; subjecting a certain membership entity to certain campaign 6 finance reporting requirements; defining certain terms; repealing certain 7 exceptions relating to a political club; and generally relating to the regulation of campaign finance activities conducted by certain political committees. 8
