Natural Resources - Soft Crabs - Bycatch

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain regulations adopted by the Department of 4 Natural Resources to establish a permissible bycatch for soft crabs to be no more restrictive than the permissible bycatch for hard crabs and peeler crabs: 5 creating a certain exception to the prohibition against possessing a bycatch of 6 7 undersized soft crabs; requiring the Department of Natural Resources to adopt certain regulations relating to a bycatch for soft crabs; making this Act an 8 emergency measure; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally 9 relating to catching or possessing soft crabs. 10

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency		
17	measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety		
18	has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members		
19	elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from		

elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted. It shall remain effective through June 30, 2009 and, at the end of June 30, 2009, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
