1	Constitution on January 23, 1964, which made it illegal to condition the right to vote
2	in federal elections on the payment of a poll tax or other tax and made it easier for

- WHEREAS, Many famous Black Americans were born during the month of January, including Martin Luther King, Jr., George Washington Carver, Sojourner Truth, and Nathaniel Turner; and
- WHEREAS, All Americans should learn about and recognize the achievements of Black Americans, the important role that Black Americans played throughout the entire history of the United States, and the scientific, literary, and social impact of Black Americans on our world today; and
- WHEREAS, The General Assembly believes that the months of January and month of February should be commemorated as the Black History Months Month in Maryland; now, therefore,
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 18 (A) IN RECOGNITION OF THE HISTORICAL CONTRIBUTIONS THAT
 19 BLACK AMERICANS HAVE MADE TO THE STATE, THE GOVERNOR SHALL
 20 PROCLAIM THE MONTHS OF JANUARY AND MONTH OF FEBRUARY EACH YEAR AS
 21 BLACK HISTORY MONTHS MONTH.
- 22 (B) THE PROCLAMATION SHALL URGE EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL 23 ORGANIZATIONS TO OBSERVE BLACK HISTORY MONTHS MONTH PROPERLY 24 WITH APPROPRIATE PROGRAMS, CEREMONIES, AND ACTIVITIES.
- 25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 26 October 1, 2007.
