CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

State Board of Physicians - Subpoenas - Medical Records for Mental Health Services

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring certain health care providers, in accordance with a 5 subpoena, to disclose certain medical records for mental health services to the 6 State Board of Physicians for certain investigations into complaints made by a 7 certain person under certain circumstances; authorizing the Board to issue 8 certain subpoenas for medical records for mental health services for certain 9 investigations if on a certain date the Board notifies the patient by certified mail that the subpoena has been issued and that the patient may assert certain 10 11 rights within a certain period of time; authorizing the Board to require the disclosure of certain medical records if certain rights are not asserted within a 12 certain period of time; and generally relating to the issuance of subpoenas for 13 medical records for mental health services by the State Board of Physicians. 14

 7 COMPLAINT RECEIVED BY THE BOARD FROM A PERSON OTHER THAN THE
 8 PATIENT, ON THE SAME DATE THE SUBPOENA IS ISSUED, THE BOARD SHALL:
- 9 1. NOTIFY THE PATIENT BY CERTIFIED MAIL, 10 RETURN RECEIPT REQUESTED, THAT THE BOARD IS ISSUING THE SUBPOENA 11 FOR THE RECORDS AND THAT THE PATIENT HAS A RIGHT TO:
- A. ASSERT ANY CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHT OR OTHER
 LEGAL AUTHORITY IN OPPOSITION TO THE DISCLOSURE OF THE MEDICAL
 RECORD BY FILING A MOTION TO QUASH OR A MOTION FOR A PROTECTIVE
 ORDER IN THE CIRCUIT COURT FOR THE JURISDICTION IN WHICH THE PATIENT
 RESIDES WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER RECEIVING THE NOTICE; AND
- B. REQUEST A HEARING ON THE MOTION IN THE CIRCUIT COURT; AND
- 2. NOTIFY THE RECIPIENT OF THE SUBPOENA BY
 CERTIFIED MAIL, RETURN RECEIPT REQUESTED, THAT THE PATIENT HAS BEEN
 SENT THE NOTICE REQUIRED UNDER ITEM 1 OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH.
- 22 (II) IF A PATIENT WHO RECEIVES NOTICE UNDER
 23 SUBPARAGRAPH (I)1 OF THIS PARAGRAPH DOES NOT ASSERT A RIGHT UNDER
 24 THIS PARAGRAPH WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER RECEIVING THE NOTICE, THE BOARD
 25 MAY REQUIRE THE RECIPIENT OF THE SUBPOENA TO DISCLOSE THE PATIENT'S
 26 MEDICAL RECORDS FOR MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2007.
