3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Southern Maryland Charles County Prostate 4 Cancer Pilot Program; providing for the purpose of the Program; providing for 5 eligibility for the Program; requiring the Program to provide certain services and activities; requiring the Program to be funded as provided in the State 6 7 budget; requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to distribute 8 grants to certain local health departments to administer the Program; requiring 9 the Department to make a certain report to certain committees of the General 10 Assembly on or before a certain date; authorizing a certain local health officer to 11 establish an advisory committee to oversee a certain grant process and community education and outreach effort; defining certain terms; providing for 12 the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Southern Maryland 13 Charles County Prostate Cancer Pilot Program. 14

2 3	WHEREAS, Prostate cancer is the most common cancer and the second leading cause of cancer death among men; and
4 5	WHEREAS, More than 200,000 men are diagnosed with prostate cancer each year in the United States; and
6 7	WHEREAS, African–American men face a far greater risk from prostate cancer than Caucasian men; and
8 9 10	WHEREAS, Caucasian men will contract prostate cancer at a rate of 147 per 100,000 while African–American men will contract prostate cancer at a rate of 222 per 100,000; and
11 12	WHEREAS, Southern Maryland <u>Charles County</u> has the highest incidence of prostate cancer diagnoses and deaths in Maryland; and
13 14	WHEREAS, Men living in rural areas are diagnosed with higher–stage prostate cancer than men living in urban areas; and
15 16 17	WHEREAS, Men whose prostate cancer is detected in the earlier stages have a 5-year survival rate of 94%, while men whose prostate cancer is diagnosed in advanced stages have a 5-year survival rate of 30%; and
18 19 20	WHEREAS, The Prostate Cancer National Blueprint for Action calls for screening and treatment, health promotion and education, education and support for parents, and public policy action; and
21 22 23	WHEREAS, Due to the increased public awareness of prostate cancer, programs should be established for prostate cancer education, early detection, and treatment services for underserved populations; now, therefore,

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<u>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the local health officer in</u>
 <u>Charles County may establish an advisory committee to oversee the grant process and</u>
 <u>community education and outreach effort under the Charles County Prostate Pilot</u>
 <u>Program established under Section 1 of this Act.</u>

5 SECTION <u>2.</u> <u>3.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 6 effect October 1, 2007. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end 7 of September 30, 2010, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this 8 Act shall be abregated and of no further force and effect
