BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 14 15 **Article - State Personnel and Pensions** 16 26-201.

- 10 (6) a State Fire Marshal or Deputy State Fire Marshal who 11 transferred from the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees' Pension 12 System on or after December 1, 1996;
- 13 (7) a member of the Morgan State University Police Force who 14 transferred from the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees' Pension 15 System on or after December 1, 1997;
- 16 (8) a member of the BWI Airport Fire & Rescue Department who 17 transferred from the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees' Pension 18 System on or after April 1, 1998;

- 12 (b) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, membership in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System is optional for an individual described in § 26–201 of this subtitle:

- 17 (ii) who was employed by the Field Enforcement Division on 18 June 30, 1995 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;
- 19 (iii) who was employed by the Maryland Transportation 20 Authority on June 30, 1997 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 21 2002;
- 22 (iv) who was employed by the Baltimore City Sheriff's 23 Department on June 30, 1997 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 24 2002;
- 25 (v) who was employed by the University of Maryland Police 26 Force on June 30, 1999 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;
- (vi) who is employed by a participating governmental unit on the effective date of participation on or after July 1, 1999 for that participating governmental unit and who elects membership within 6 months of the effective date of participation;
- 31 (vii) who was employed by the Maryland Port Administration 32 Police Force and was subsequently transferred to and employed by the Maryland

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- 1 Transportation Authority Police Force on July 1, 1998 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;
- 3 (viii) who was employed by the office of the State Fire Marshal on

June 30, 1998 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;

- 5 (ix) who was employed by the Morgan State University Police
- 6 Force on June 30, 1999 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;
- 7 (x) who was employed by the BWI Airport Fire & Rescue
- 8 Department on June 30, 2000, and who elects membership on or before December 31,

- 11 Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Motor Vehicle Administration, and

- 19 accordance with the Maryland Police and Correctional Training Commissions, and
- 20 who elects membership on or before December 31, 2002;
- 21 (xiv) who was employed on June 30, 2004, by the Salisbury Fire
- 22 Department as a firefighter or paramedic and who elects membership on or before
- December 31, 2004, if eligible under Title 31, Subtitle 2A of this article; [or]
