1 AN ACT concerning

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## Disease Prevention - Sexually Transmitted Diseases - Expedited Partner Therapy Pilot Program

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Expedited Partner Therapy Pilot Program in the 5 Baltimore City Health Department; providing for the purpose of the Program; authorizing certain health care providers to prescribe, dispense, or otherwise 6 7 provide certain antibiotic therapy to certain partners of patients diagnosed with 8 certain sexually transmitted diseases without making a certain physical 9 assessment; requiring the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene and the 10 Commissioner of the Baltimore City Health Department to adopt jointly certain regulations; establishing civil immunity for certain health care providers in 11 12 certain circumstances; requiring the Baltimore City Health Department to report to the Governor and General Assembly regarding the operation and 13 14 performance of the Program on or before a certain date each year; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the prevention of sexually 15 16 transmitted diseases and the Expedited Partner Therapy Pilot Program.

- 3 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE 4 MEANINGS INDICATED.
- 5 (2) "COMMISSIONER" MEANS THE COMMISSIONER OF HEALTH 6 OF THE BALTIMORE CITY HEALTH DEPARTMENT.
- 7 (3) "PROGRAM" MEANS THE EXPEDITED PARTNER THERAPY 8 PILOT PROGRAM.
- 9 **(B)** THERE IS AN EXPEDITED PARTNER THERAPY PILOT PROGRAM IN 10 THE BALTIMORE CITY HEALTH DEPARTMENT.
- 11 (C) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE ANTIBIOTIC
  12 THERAPY TO THE PARTNER OF A PATIENT DIAGNOSED WITH A SEXUALLY
  13 TRANSMITTED INFECTION IDENTIFIED IN SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION IN
  14 ORDER TO CONTAIN THE INFECTION AND STOP THE FURTHER SPREAD OF IT.

  20 PERSONAL PHYSICAL ASSESSMENT OF THE PATIENT'S PARTNER:
- 21 (1) A PHYSICIAN LICENSED UNDER TITLE 14 OF THE HEALTH 22 OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE;
- 23 **(2) A CERTIFIED NURSE PRACTITIONER IN ACCORDANCE WITH** 24 § 8–508 OF THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE; AND
- 25 **(3)** AN AUTHORIZED PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT IN ACCORDANCE 26 WITH § 15–302.2 OF THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE.
- 27 (E) THE SECRETARY AND THE COMMISSIONER JOINTLY SHALL ADOPT 28 REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

1	(F) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, A LICENSED
2	PHYSICIAN, CERTIFIED NURSE PRACTITIONER, LICENSED REGISTERED NURSE,
3	LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE, OR CERTIFIED PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT MAY NOT
4	BE HELD CIVILLY LIABLE FOR ANY ACT OR OMISSION PERFORMED IN
5	ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION IF:

- 6 (1) THE ACT OR OMISSION DOES NOT CONSTITUTE GROSS 7 NEGLIGENCE;
- 8 (2) THE PRESCRIPTION ANTIBIOTIC THERAPY IS PROVIDED TO
  9 THE PATIENT'S PARTNER WITHOUT FEE OR OTHER COMPENSATION FROM THE
  10 PATIENT'S PARTNER; OR
- 11 (3) THE PRESCRIPTION ANTIBIOTIC THERAPY IS PROVIDED IN
  12 BALTIMORE CITY TO THE PATIENT AT A PUBLIC HEALTH CLINIC FOR THE
  13 PATIENT'S SEXUAL PARTNER.
- 14 (G) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2007, AND EACH YEAR THEREAFTER,
  15 THE BALTIMORE CITY HEALTH DEPARTMENT SHALL REPORT TO THE
  16 GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE,
  17 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, ON THE OPERATION AND PERFORMANCE OF THE
  18 EXPEDITED PARTNER THERAPY PILOT PROGRAM.
  - SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2007. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of June 30, 2012, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
