# State Board of Nursing - Advanced Nurse Practitioners - Membership and Qualifications

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring that the State Board of Nursing consist of a certain number of members certified in an advanced practice nursing specialty; 5 requiring the Governor to appoint certain members from a list of nominees 6 7 submitted by certain organizations; requiring that a certain number of nominees be on a certain list of nominations; requiring that certain 8 9 organizations nominate certain nurses with a certain certification from a 10 certain list of specialties for each vacancy for each term and that certain organizations rotate the specialty of nominations among certain specialties; 11 requiring that certain members meet certain educational and professional 12 requirements; and generally relating to the State Board of Nursing and 13 membership. 14

(h) 23 Before taking office, each appointee to the Board shall take the oath 24 required by Article I, § 9 of the State Constitution. 25 (i) (1)The term of a member is 4 years, except that the initial term of 1 of the consumer members is 2 years. 26 27 (2)The terms of the members are staggered as required by the terms provided for members of the Board on July 1, 1981. 28

1 (3) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor 2 is appointed and qualifies.

3 (4) A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for 4 the rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

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(5) A member may not serve more than 2 consecutive full terms.

6 (6) To the extent practicable, the Governor shall fill any vacancy on 7 the Board within 60 days of the date of the vacancy.

8 (j) (1) The Governor may remove a member for incompetence, 9 misconduct, neglect of a duty required by law, unprofessional conduct, or dishonorable 10 conduct.

11 (2) Upon the recommendation of the Secretary, the Governor may 12 remove a member whom the Secretary finds to have been absent from 2 successive 13 Board meetings without adequate reason.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2007.
