CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Working Waterfront Commission

FOR the purpose of establishing the Working Waterfront Commission; providing for the composition of the Commission; providing for the appointment of the chair of the Commission; requiring the Commission to study and make recommendations regarding protecting and preserving Maryland's commercial seafood industry's access to public trust waters; requiring the Commission to submit a certain report to the Governor and General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the staffing of the Commission; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the establishment of the Working Waterfront Commission.

WHEREAS, Working waterfronts play a vital role in the economy, heritage, culture, and history of Maryland; and

19 20	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:		
21	(a)	There is a Working Waterfront Commission.	
22	(b)	The Commission consists of the following members:

2	(1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Commission; but
3 4	(2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
5 6 7	(f) The Commission shall study and make recommendations regarding protecting and preserving Maryland's commercial fishing industry's access to public trust waters.
8 9 10	(g) On or before December 15, 2007, the Commission shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.
11 12 13 14	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2007. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of May 31, 2008, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
