## Article 20C - Mid-Shore Regional Council

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- 5 (a) The membership of the Council consists of the following members from 6 Caroline, Dorchester, and Talbot counties:
- 7 (1) [Nine] **SIX COUNCILMEMBERS OR** commissioners, [three] **TWO** 8 from each county, appointed by their respective county governing bodies as voting 9 members;
- 10 (2) Three county administrators, one from each county as nonvoting ex 11 officio members;
- 12 (3) (i) Three municipal elected officials, one from each county, 13 appointed by their respective municipal corporations as voting members; or
- 14 (ii) If the municipal corporations located in a county are unable 15 to choose a municipal elected official within a reasonable period of time, the Eastern 16 Shore Municipal Association shall appoint an elected municipal official to represent 17 the municipal corporation;
- 18 (4) Members of the General Assembly representing the region who 19 have a majority of their legislative district in the region as voting ex officio members;
- 20 (5) Members of the General Assembly representing the region who do 21 not have a majority of their legislative district in the region as nonvoting ex officio 22 members; and
- 23 (6) The other **COUNCILMEMBERS OR** commissioners as nonvoting ex officio members.
- 25 (b) (1) A voting **COUNCILMEMBER OR** commissioner listed under 26 subsection (a)(1) of this section may designate another **COUNCILMEMBER OR** 27 commissioner or county administrator representing the same county to vote by proxy 28 on behalf of the voting **COUNCILMEMBER OR** commissioner when the voting 29 **COUNCILMEMBER OR** commissioner is absent from a meeting.
