A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Wicomico County – Alcoholic Beverages – Minimum Seating Capacity for**
3 **Licensed Restaurants**

4 FOR the purpose of lowering the minimum seating capacity requirement for
5 restaurants in Wicomico County for which a Class B beer, wine and liquor
6 license is issued; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in
7 Wicomico County.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article 2B – Alcoholic Beverages**

21 6–201.

1 (a) (1) A Class B beer, wine and liquor license shall be issued by the
2 license issuing authority of the county in which the place of business is located, and
3 the license authorizes its holder to keep for sale and sell all alcoholic beverages at
4 retail at any hotel or restaurant at the place described, for consumption on the
5 premises or elsewhere, or as provided in this section.

6 (x) (1) This subsection applies only in Wicomico County.

7 (2) (iv) 1. This license may be issued only to a restaurant that:

8 C. Has a regular seating capacity at tables (not including
9 seats at bars or counters) for [75] **40** or more persons seated comfortably and
10 adequately and shall meet the minimum requirements of the fire code applicable to
11 the jurisdiction where the restaurant is located; and

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 July 1, 2007.
