2 **Professional Corporations – Physical Therapists**

3 FOR the purpose of including as a professional service that may be rendered through a
4 professional corporation the services of a physical therapist; altering a certain
5 definition; and generally relating to professional corporations.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article – Corporations and Associations**

2 5–101.

3 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

4 (f) “Professional corporation” means a corporation organized under this
5 subtitle for the purpose of rendering professional services.

6 (g) (1) “Professional service” means a service that may lawfully be
7 rendered only by a person licensed or otherwise authorized by a licensing unit in the
8 State to render the service and that may not lawfully be rendered by a corporation
9 under the Maryland General Corporation Law.

10 (2) “Professional service” includes, but is not limited to, a service
11 provided by:

12 (i) An architect;

13 (ii) An attorney;

14 (iii) A certified public accountant;

15 (iv) A chiropractor;

16 (v) A dentist;

17 (vi) An osteopath;

18 (vii) A podiatrist;

19 (viii) A physician;

20 (ix) A professional engineer;

21 (x) A licensed real estate broker, licensed real estate
22 salesperson, and licensed associate real estate broker;

23 (xi) A veterinarian; [and]

24 (xii) A psychologist; **AND**

1 **(XIII) A PHYSICAL THERAPIST.**

2 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
3 October 1, 2007.
