## A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

## **Commission on Civic Literacy**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Commission on Civic Literacy; establishing the membership of the Commission; requiring the Commission to elect certain 4 5 officers from among its members; requiring the State Department of Education 6 to provide staff and certain other support to the Commission; prohibiting a 7 member of the Commission from receiving certain compensation, but 8 authorizing a member of the Commission to receive certain reimbursements; 9 requiring the Commission to hold certain meetings; authorizing the Commission 10 to hold additional meetings under certain circumstances; requiring certain officials to jointly call the first meeting of the Commission; requiring the 11 12 Commission to develop, support, and coordinate certain programs; requiring the Commission to develop a clearinghouse on the Internet including certain 13 14 information; requiring the Commission to submit a certain report to the Governor and General Assembly annually by a certain date; authorizing the 15 16 Commission to seek and use certain funds and services from certain sources; 17 providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Commission on Civic Literacy. 18

- 1 (22) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE CITIZENSHIP
  2 LAW-RELATED EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR THE SCHOOLS OF MARYLAND, OR
  3 THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S DESIGNEE;
- 4 (23) A MEMBER OF THE POLICY STUDIES ORGANIZATION IN THE 5 UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF MARYLAND, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR;
- 6 (24) THE CHAIR OF THE EDUCATION THAT IS MULTICULTURAL AND ACHIEVEMENT NETWORK, OR THE CHAIR'S DESIGNEE;
- 8 (25) THE PRESIDENT OF THE MARYLAND COUNCIL FOR THE 9 SOCIAL STUDIES, OR THE PRESIDENT'S DESIGNEE;
- 10 (26) THE DIRECTOR OF THE CENTER FOR INFORMATION AND
  11 RESEARCH ON CIVIC LEARNING AND ENGAGEMENT (CIRCLE), OR THE
  12 DIRECTOR'S DESIGNEE; AND
- 13 (27) Two students enrolled in public high schools in 14 Maryland, appointed by the Maryland Association of Student 15 Councils.
- 16 (B) FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS, THE COMMISSION SHALL ELECT A
  17 CHAIR, VICE CHAIR, AND ANY OTHER OFFICERS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT ITS
  18 FUNCTIONS.
- 19 (C) THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL PROVIDE STAFF 20 AND OTHER NECESSARY SUPPORT TO THE COMMISSION USING EXISTING 21 RESOURCES.
- 22 (D) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION
  23 AS A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION, BUT IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR
  24 EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED
  25 IN THE STATE BUDGET.
- 26 (E) THE COMMISSION SHALL MEET AT LEAST TWICE EACH YEAR AND
  27 MAY HOLD ADDITIONAL MEETINGS AT THE DISCRETION OF THE CHAIR OR AT
  28 THE REQUEST OF A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS. THE PRESIDENT OF THE
  29 SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES ACTING JOINTLY
  30 SHALL CALL THE FIRST MEETING OF THE COMMISSION.

4 5	(I) REASONED DEBATE, GOOD FAITH, NEGOTIATION, AND COMPROMISE IN REPRESENTATIVE DEMOCRACY;
6 7	(II) INDIVIDUAL INVOLVEMENT IN CREATING SUCCESSFUL COMMUNITIES; AND
8 9 10	(III) CONSIDERATION AND RESPECT FOR OTHERS IN DELIBERATING, NEGOTIATING, AND ADVOCATING POSITIONS ON PUBLIC CONCERNS;
11 12	(2) IDENTIFY CIVIC EDUCATION PROJECTS IN MARYLAND AND PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO THOSE PROJECTS AS NEEDED;
13 14	(3) BUILD A NETWORK OF EDUCATION PROFESSIONALS TO SHARE INFORMATION AND STRENGTHEN PARTNERSHIPS;
15 16	(4) CONSULT WITH ORGANIZATIONS REPRESENTED ON THE COMMISSION AS APPROPRIATE;
17 18	(5) DEVELOP A CLEARINGHOUSE THAT SHALL BE AVAILABLE ON THE INTERNET TO INCLUDE:
19 20	(I) A DATABASE OF CIVIC EDUCATION RESOURCES, LESSON PLANS, AND OTHER PROGRAMS AND BEST PRACTICES IN CIVIC EDUCATION;
21 22	(II) A BULLETIN BOARD TO PROMOTE DISCUSSION OF IDEAS RELATING TO CIVIC EDUCATION;
23	(III) AN EVENTS CALENDAR; AND
24	(IV) LINKS TO CIVIC EDUCATION RESEARCH;

- 3 (7) REPORT ON ITS ACTIVITIES TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN 4 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE 5 GENERAL ASSEMBLY, ANNUALLY ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1 OF EACH YEAR.
- 6 (G) THE COMMISSION MAY:
- 7 (1) SEEK, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND FUNDS FROM ANY SOURCE, 8 INCLUDING DONATIONS, STATE APPROPRIATIONS, AND FEDERAL GRANTS; AND
- 9 (2) SEEK, ACCEPT, AND USE SERVICES FROM INDIVIDUALS, 10 CORPORATIONS, AND GOVERNMENT ENTITIES.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
  October 1, 2007. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of
  September 30, 2012, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act
  shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
