## 1 AN ACT concerning

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## Dental Hygiene - Administration of Local Anesthesia

3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of dental hygiene to include the 4 administration of certain anesthesia under certain circumstances; authorizing 5 the State Board of Dental Examiners to adopt certain regulations; altering the 6 authority of the Board to adopt certain rules and regulations concerning the 7 administration of certain anesthesia by certain dental hygienists; authorizing 8 certain dental hygienists to administer certain anesthesia under certain 9 circumstances; requiring certain dental hygienists to meet certain educational 10 and examination requirements prior to administering certain anesthesia; authorizing a dentist to condition employment of a certain dental hygienist on 11 12 the administration of a certain anesthesia without facing certain grounds for discipline; providing certain grounds for the discipline of certain dentists and 13 certain dental hygienists; and generally relating to dental hygiene and the 14 administration of local anesthesia. 15
