FOR the purpose of requiring the Board of Public Works, in consultation with the Department of General Services <u>and the Department of Housing and</u> <u>Community Development</u>, to adopt regulations to establish certain standards and specifications to enhance the indoor air quality of <u>certain</u> relocatable classrooms; <u>providing for the application of this Act</u>; and generally relating to regulations governing the indoor air quality of relocatable classrooms.

effect October 1, 2007.
