## A BILL ENTITLED

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- 3 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System; providing that certain members of the Correctional Officers' Retirement 4 5 System may receive a normal service retirement or a deferred vested retirement 6 allowance under certain circumstances; requiring the transfer of certain 7 member contributions to the annuity savings fund of the Correctional Officers' 8 Retirement System; providing for a refund of certain member contributions 9 under certain circumstances; providing that certain transfers of credit between 10 the Employees' Retirement and Pension Systems and the Correctional Officers' Retirement System are not governed by certain provisions of law; and generally 11 12 relating to membership in the Correctional Officers' Retirement System.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 1 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, this subtitle applies 2 only to: 3 (1) correctional officers serving in any of the first six job 4 classifications; 5 (2)security attendants at Clifton T. 12 13 14 15 16	(b) The transfer of creditable service for an individual described in subsection (a) of this section who is a member of either the Employees' Retirement System or Employees' Pension System on June 30, 2007, who transfers to the Correctional Officers' Retirement System under this Act, is not governed by Title 37 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article.
17 18 19 20	(c) The Board of Trustees shall transfer the total member contributions to the individual's credit in either the Employees' Retirement System or Employees' Pension System, plus regular interest, to the annuity savings fund of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System.

(2) An individual described under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall receive the difference between the member contributions at the rate provided for in the Correctional Officers' Retirement System, including interest on those contributions, and the total accumulated member contributions to the individual's credit, plus interest on those contributions, in the annuity savings fund of the Employees' Retirement System.

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SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2007.
