6	(1) The Mayor;

12 13 14 15	The Maryland Emergency Management Assistance Compact is entered into with: (1) [all] ALL other jurisdictions that adopt the Compact in a form substantially similar to the Compact set forth in this subtitle; AND
16 17	(2) EACH EMERGENCY RESPONDER OR LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER ORGANIZATION, IF:
18 19 20	(I) THE ORGANIZATION PROVIDES WRITTEN CONSENT TO BE BOUND BY THE TERMS OF THE COMPACT TO THE SENIOR ELECTED OFFICIAL OF THE COUNTY OR POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE ORGANIZATION; AND
21 22 23	(II) THE WRITTEN CONSENT REQUIRED BY SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH IS ACKNOWLEDGED BY A RESOLUTION OF THE LOCAL GOVERNING BODY.
