Children with Disabilities - Voluntary Placement Agreements

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the juvenile court to make a certain finding in certain 4 hearings involving a child with a developmental disability or mental illness; 5 authorizing the juvenile court, in making a disposition on a child in need of assistance petition involving a child with a developmental disability or mental 6 7 illness, to make a certain finding and hold a certain finding in abeyance, require 8 a local department of social services to take certain actions, and hold a certain 9 hearing; requiring each local department of social services to designate a certain 10 staff person to administer requests for voluntary placement agreements for children with developmental disabilities or mental illnesses; requiring each 11 local department of social services to make a certain annual report to the Social 12 Services Administration; requiring a local department of social services to take 13 certain actions on receipt of a request for a voluntary placement agreement for a 14 child with a developmental disability or mental illness; requiring the Social 15 Services Administration to provide certain training for certain staff who 16 17 administer requests for voluntary placement agreements; and generally relating 18 to children with disabilities or mental illnesses and voluntary placement 19 agreements.
