- FOR the purpose of authorizing a licensed physician to delegate certain duties to nonphysician surgical assistants; requiring nonphysician surgical assistants to be certified by certain professional organizations; defining a certain term; and generally relating the delegation of duties by physicians to nonphysician surgical assistants.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

  - (I) "NONPHYSICIAN SURGICAL ASSISTANT" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL PROVIDING AID UNDER DIRECT SUPERVISION IN EXPOSURE, HEMOSTASIS, CLOSURES, AND OTHER INTRAOPERATIVE TECHNICAL FUNCTIONS THAT ASSIST A PHYSICIAN IN PERFORMING A SAFE OPERATION.
- [(i)] (J) "Perform acupuncture" means to stimulate a certain point or points on or near the surface of the human body by the insertion of needles to prevent or modify the perception of pain or to normalize physiological functions, including pain control, for the treatment of ailments or conditions of the body.
- [(j)] (K) "Physician" means an individual who practices medicine.
- [(k)] (L) "Physician Rehabilitation Committee" means the committee of the entity or entities with whom the Board contracts under § 14–401(e) of this title that evaluates and provides assistance to impaired physicians in need of treatment and rehabilitation for alcoholism, chemical dependency, or other physical, emotional, or mental conditions.
