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Statewide Empowerment Zones for Seniors Commission

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Statewide Empowerment Zones for Seniors 4 Commission; providing for the membership of the Commission; authorizing the 5 Commission to consult with certain individuals and entities; authorizing the Secretary of Aging to perform certain duties; requiring the Commission to make 6 7 certain recommendations; providing for the requirements for a qualifying 8 comprehensive empowerment zone for seniors plan; requiring the Department 9 of Aging to staff the Commission; requiring the Commission to submit certain 10 reports to the Governor and General Assembly on or before certain dates; providing that a member of the Commission may receive a certain 11 reimbursement; providing for a certain annual appropriation to the 12 Commission; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to 13 the Statewide Empowerment Zones for Seniors Commission. 14

4 5 6	WHEREAS, In the first two decades of the 21st century, the population of Marylanders over age 60 is expected to rise by 74%, to nearly 1.4 million, according to U.S. Census Bureau estimates; and

It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of May 31 September 30, 2009, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
